# Background Metting with Leaves and picots 2nd variation



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## Abbreviations:

$$st(s) - stitch(s)$$
 p - picot drp - drooping picot

# Step-by-step pattern

To start this background netting, you can choose regular chain, or as in this pattern double chain (aka single crochet foundation chain). I found it easier to start with double chain because of its structure. In the video tutorial (see last page) | explain how to crochet double chain.

Crochet chain multiple of 9 + 1 st.

In this example ch36+1. I used double chain (aka sc chain) to start this sample. Ch1, turn your work.

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# R1:

sc into the 1st st of the chain;

\*[ch3; then make drp/p:

(ch5; remove hook from the last st, insert hook into  $5^{th}$  stitch from the hook, and pull last st through) – this completes the drp;

make top p: (ch5, close p w/ss into the 5<sup>th</sup> st from the hook);

make a ss between the drp and p to complete drp/p;

ch6; make drp/p; ch3;

skip 8sts on a double chain; sc into the 9th st.

Crochet A2L:

\*\*ch8; on the chain crochet leaf: (sc; hdc; 2dc; hdc; sc);

make a transition ss into the 8th st of a ch;

crochet on the other side of the ch8: (sc; hdc; 2dc; hdc; sc)\*\*;

ch1; repeat from \*\* to \*\*; skip 8sts on the double chain; sc into the 9th st.]\*

Repeat from \*[ to]\* one more time for our sample or to the end of the double chain.



# R2: ch12 (for turning chain);

\*\*\* crochet L; sc into the chain between the leaves of the R1; crochet L;

ch3; make drp/p; ch3; sc into the ch6 of the R1; ch3; drp/p; ch3 \*\*\*;

Repeat from \*\*\* to \*\*\* one more time for this sample, or to the end of the row. At the end of the row make a long stitch that consists of 10yo.

### Please notice:

for some of you **long stitch** and **ch12** have to be adjusted to individual tension, which means that you probably will need to make 7, 8, or 9 yo instead of 10, and for the ch12 it will be probably enough ch10.

### R3:

{crochet A2L; sc into the st between the bar with drp/p and the L of the R2; ch3; then make drp/p; ch6; drp/p; ch3};

Repeat from {to} one more time for this sample, or to the end of the row. Finish the R3 w/sc into a st between L and ch12 of R2.

### R4:

ch12; \*\*[ch3; drp/p; ch3; sc into the ch6 of R3; ch3; drp/p; ch3; crochet L; sc between the A2L of the R3; crochet L]\*\*;
repeat from \*\*[to]\*\* one more time for this sample, or to the end of the row;

crochet long st.

R5:

\*\*\* [ch3; drp/p; ch6; drp/p; ch3; sc into a st between the L and the bar w/drp/p; A2L] \*\*\*; sc into a st between the bar w/srp/p and the L.

Repeat from \*\*\* [to] \*\*\*; finish the R5 w/sc into the st between the bar w/drp/p and the ch12 of the R4.

Repeat the pattern from R2.
